The 'Quick to Zip' upgrade

The 'Quick to Zip' upgrade, or 'QtZ', is characterized by a running line in which the horse in question was,

- a) too close to the early pace in a Closer favoring CFR before
- b) making a premature run to (or closer to) the lead before
- c) being caught from behind by one or more horses

The Racing FlowTM enhanced DRF FORMULATOR PPs for **Anytime Anyplace** are posted below. The Flow figures may be found on the right side of the page under the company line, in **bold**.

THE FIGURES

- **CFR**: 90 is just on the edges of being grade-worthy. This is a Closer favoring CFR. Thus, we look to upgrade horses in front of the winner in the early stages, or downgrade those that were in a similar early position as the winner.
- **BL12**: 11.3 is the beaten lengths of the race winner at the 1st two calls combined. Looking at the running line, we see that this horse had a BL12 of \sim 5.5, which is significantly less than the winner. Therefore, this effort desrves upgrading.
- Flow: +130 indicates a a pace dynamic that proved difficult for speed
- **Bias**: 'none' due to a lack of turf races that day
- * On Friday, the 6th of March, **Anytime Anyplace (\$9.40)** recorded a **'Neutral or Better Win'** for Flow players as his race's lone upgrade.
